MY WORDS IN YOUR MOUTH 1

(Isa 51:16) And I have put my words in thy mouth, and I have covered thee in the shadow of mine hand, that I may plant the heavens, and lay the foundations of the earth, and say unto Zion, Thou art my people.

A. GOD HAS ORDAINED THAT YOU HAVE "POWER IN YOUR MOUTH": *Read:* (*Mk* 11:22-24, *Rm*.4:17)

- The words that God puts in your mouth are His words; and they have power.
- God's Word in your mouth gives you the ability to plant the heavens, and the ability to establish His will upon the earth.
- The Spirit of God that is upon you & His Word in your mouth work together to change any situation in your life. (*Isaiah 59:19-21*)
- God's Word in your mouth empowers you:
 - i. Plant the heavens in your life.
 - ii. "Call the things that be not as though they were".
 - iii. Change any situation, e.g. Healing the sick and raising the dead.

B. 'IN ORDER' TO PLANT THE HEAVENS IN YOUR LIFE, YOU MUST CONSECRATE YOUR MOUTH TO GOD AND TO HIS GLORY:

- God's Word and devilish words cannot come out of the same mouth (*Jas 3:10-12*)
- It is very important that you understand that you cannot use your mouth to curse, slander and gossip, and also bless.
- When you assign your mouth as an instrument of the devil and you also confess the Word of God, the Word of God in your mouth becomes powerless and cannot yield fruitful results.
- Use your mouth to speak only the Word of God.

C. YOUR MOUTH IS A LIKE POWERFUL SWORD (Isaiah 49:1-3)

- When you consecrate your mouth to God, He will empower your words and He will make your mouth a powerful sword.
- When you consecrate your mouth to God, supernatural things happen in your life by virtue of the words you speak; so that when you speak the Word of God it is like Jesus Himself speaking.
- Consecrating your mouth to God qualifies you for the Master's use. (Isa. 6:1-8)

D. GOD CONFIRMS THE WORDS THAT WE SPEAK:

- God said "I will put My words in your mouth and I will be with your mouth": so that when you speak it will come to pass. (Ex. 4:10-17)
- God will always confirm His Word that is in your mouth.
- Whatever you say will happen, as long as you are speaking the words that God put in your mouth.
