### GOD IS FOR YOU (II)

*(Rom 8:31) What shall we then say to these things? If God be for us, who can be against us? (MSG) So, what do you think? With God on our side like this, how can we lose?*

Regardless of what the enemy says, regardless of the appearance of things, regardless of the experiences you have had, GOD IS FOR YOU, there is no controversy about it.

*(Jos 5:13) And it came to pass, when Joshua was by Jericho, that he lifted up his eyes and looked, and, behold, there stood a man over against him with his sword drawn in his hand: and Joshua went unto him, and said unto him, Art thou for us, or for our adversaries?*

#### THE DOOR INTO THE PROMISED LAND

- When Joshua was by Jericho and he lifted up his eyes and saw the walls, the gates were shut up and tightly closed because of the Israelites.

*(Jos 6:1 AMP) Now Jericho [a fenced town with high walls] was tightly closed because of the Israelites; no one went out or came in.*

- Jericho represents the door into the Promised Land. Even though God had already said “I have given you the land”, the gates were tightly closed so they could not enter.
- One of the most difficult experiences of a believer is trying to line up his or her experiences with what God is saying.
- When you receive a prophetic Word and years go by without the manifestation of the promise, don't be lethargic with the Word of God. Keep believing.
- God is for you, He has a plan and a purpose for you. His purpose is glory, not shame; and all things will work together for your good. (Rom 8:28-31) (Isa 50:7)
- When opposition arises in your life, be confident; be resolved that regardless what you see, God is for you.
- When you have questions about why things are not working the way they should, remember God is for you.
