GLORY (II)

A. JESUS: THE LORD MANIFESTS HIS GLORY.

*(Joh 2:11 AMP) This, the first of His signs (miracles, wonderworks), Jesus performed in Cana of Galilee, and **manifested His glory [by it He displayed His greatness and His power openly]**, and His disciples believed in Him [adhered to, trusted in, and relied on Him]*

Read: Joh 2:1-11 (read vrs. 11 in the AMP), Joh 1:1-5 & 14, Is.9:2,Psa. 24:7.

- Mary made Jesus active by telling Him “they have no wine” (Joh 2:3)
- Jesus made a public display of His greatness and His power. *(Joh 2:11)* He did something they had never experienced before and they were all in awe of it.

B. JESUS GAVE CLEAR CUT INSTRUCTIONS: (Joh 2:6-8)

1. Fill the water pots with water
 2. Now, draw out.
 3. Give it to the governor.
- The key to “GLORY” is complete, total obedience.
 - A lot of times the instructions we receive from God do not make sense but we must obey it to the letter.
 - When we submit to the Lordship of Jesus, obey His word and commit to doing it, we open ourselves up to the manifestation of God’s glory in our lives.

C. JESUS OUR SAVIOR AND LORD:

- Jesus is our savior; the savior brings “LIGHT”. (Joh 1:1-5, Is. 9:2)”.
- Jesus our light became flesh and we beheld His glory. (Joh 1:14)
- At our initial salvation we receive the light of Christ giving us hope. As we continuously walk in obedience and submit to the will of God He manifests His glory in our lives.
- When Jesus gives us light, the blindness in our eyes diminishes and He shows us the opportunities we need to become all that God created us to be.

1. ***Discuss the difference between “Jesus our savior” and “Jesus our Lord”. How do we go from enjoying the light of Jesus to the glory the Lord brings?***
2. ***Is partial obedience the same as obedience? Support your answer with scripture.***
